I would like to highlight two examples which illustrate John's commitment to voluntarily serving others through the Beavercreek Rotary Club and St. Mark's Episcopal Church.

John has been an active member of the Beavercreek Rotary Club for over 28 years. His dedication to the organization is exemplified by his perfect attendance of club meetings for 25 of those years. John is a Paul Harris Fellow who provided club leadership by serving on the Board-of Directors on numerous occasions. He is a superb representative and spokesperson for the club. He has provided meaningful inductions of every new member into the club during my seven years of membership. He delivers heartfelt invocations at our club meetings on a regular basis. When it comes to these extremely important functions of our club (i.e., inductions and invocations), it can be said of John that "nobody does it better." This also applies to publicity of the club and its activities, for which John was responsible for many years. He utilized his unique skills as a retired advertising executive to provide positive exposure for the club by publishing his well-written articles in the local newspaper. John is extremely committed to youth as evidenced by his active and effective involvement for numerous years in the following activities: a) hosting several foreign exchange students, b) serving as judge of the 4-Way Speech Contest, c) delivering dictionaries as part of the Dictionary Project, d) participating in career day for high school students, e) participating in the Kid's Voting Program, and f) proposing the Rotary Royalty Student Award which is currently being established for the club. Other Rotary activities that John has been actively involved in during his many years of club service are as follows: a) serving as historian for over 10 years, b) serving as Sergeant—at—Arms, c) manning the Popcorn Festival booth, d) participating in road clean-up and e) participating in the annual golf outings. John currently volunteers for the Kemp School program, going to the school each week to work on a one-to-one level, with the children who need extra help. John served on the Board of Directors at Canterbury Court, a program of Episcopal Retirement Homes for low-income families. In appreciation for his enormous years of faithful service, John received St. Mark's Episcopal Church's Lifetime Stewardship Award which honors those who have faithfully dedicated their lives to

the parish far beyond the call of duty. John serves as a perfect role model for what it means to be a Christian.
